Brad Boyes

Born and raised in Mississauga ON, Boyes was drafted in the first round, 24th overall, by the Toronto Maple Leafs in the 2000 NHL Entry Draft. During his NHL Career, Boyes played with the San Jose Sharks, Boston Bruins, St. Louis Blues, Buffalo Sabres, New York Islanders and Florida Panthers. In 2015, Boyes signed a one-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, finishing the season with 24 points in 60 games.



Brandon "BJ" Crombeen

Crombeen is a former Captain of the Barrie Colts and a U18 World Junior Hockey championship gold medalist. Crombeen has played 445 regular season games during an eight-year span with the Dallas Stars, St. Louis Blues, Tampa Bay Lightning and Arizona Coyotes. The American-born forward was drafted in the 2nd round, 54th overall, by the Dallas Stars in 2003.



Adam Graves

Graves is a two-time Stanley Cup champion thanks to victories with the Edmonton Oilers and the New York Rangers. Graves played 1,152 regular season games during 16 NHL seasons with the Detroit Red Wings, Edmonton Oilers, New York Rangers and San Jose Sharks. He's won the King Clancy Memorial Trophy, the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy and he's had his jersey #9 retired by the Rangers.



Nathan LaFayette

Lafayette won a gold medal as part of Team Canada at the 1993 World Junior Hockey Championship. From there, he put together a solid six-year NHL career which was eventually cut short due to injuries. Before retiring, the BC native and current Oakville resident played for the St. Louis Blues, Vancouver Canucks, New York Rangers and Los Angeles Kings.



Steve Staios

Staios is an 18-year NHL veteran who played 1,001 regular season games with the Boston Bruins, Vancouver Canucks, Atlanta Thrashers, Edmonton Oilers, Calgary Flames, and New York Islanders. Staios also captured gold at the 2003 and 2004 World Championships and a silver medal at the 2008 World Championship. Today, the former Leafs assistant coach is the President and GM of the Hamilton Bulldogs.



Rick Vaive

Vaive's illustrious NHL career unfolded between 1979 and 1992. During that span, Vaive played 876 games with the Vancouver Canucks, the Toronto Maple Leafs, the Chicago Blackhawks and the Buffalo Sabres. Vaive might be best remembered as the first 50-goal scorer in Maple Leafs franchise history and as the Leafs captain for five seasons during the 1980's.



Rob Zamuner

Zamuner's outstanding 13-year NHL career featured stops with the New York Rangers, Tampa Bay Lightning, Ottawa Senators and the Boston Bruins. The former product of the Oakville minor hockey program played close to 800 regular season games from 1991 to 2004. The former Captain of the Lightning was also part of Canada's World Championship squad that won gold in 1997.
